



# FREE Motorcycle Skills Training Illinois Cycle Rider Safety Training Program

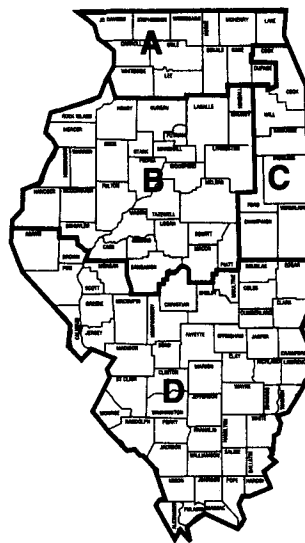
The **Basic RiderCourse** is 20 hours of on-cycle and classroom instruction for the non-rider and beginning or untrained rider. A motorcycle, helmet and insurance are provided. This course is offered at approximately 50 sites throughout Illinois between March and November each year.

The **Experienced RiderCourse** is 8 hours of on-cycle and classroom instruction. Students should have at least 1 year and 1,000 miles of riding experience, or 6 months and 500 miles for **Basic RiderCourse** graduates. Students provide their own motorcycle, protective equipment, and insurance.

These courses are sponsored by the Illinois Department of Transportation. Funding for the Cycle Rider Safety Training Program is from a portion of motorcycle license endorsements and registration fees. This information is provided by Jesse White, Secretary of State.
